

Wainuiomata Lions Apple project

What does this project involve?

- Donated apples are trucked from the Hawkes Bay to Wainuiomata and the attending club contributes towards the delivery costs (fuel, road user charges, bags, etc).
- When you arrive, a number of crates full of apples will be waiting to be packed.
- Plastic bags are provided for your use.
- Club members, friends and helpers gather around each crate, and apples are packed until each crate is emptied.

What happens to the packed apples?

- Each club identifies a number of recipients for the apples.
- The club arranges to take the agreed number, once packed, and deliver these on the way home.

How hard is this?

- Not hard at all. It involves a bit of bending over the crate to pack the apples.
- There's plenty of time for laughing and chatting to fellow club members and friends, and catching up with other lions across the district.
- Suggest you wear casual clothes with practical footwear to support you.

How long will it take?

- Approximately one hour to do the apple packing.
- Travel time to get to Wainuiomata (shared rides?)
- A little bit longer to get home, allowing for stops en route delivering bags of apples (to very happy recipients).
