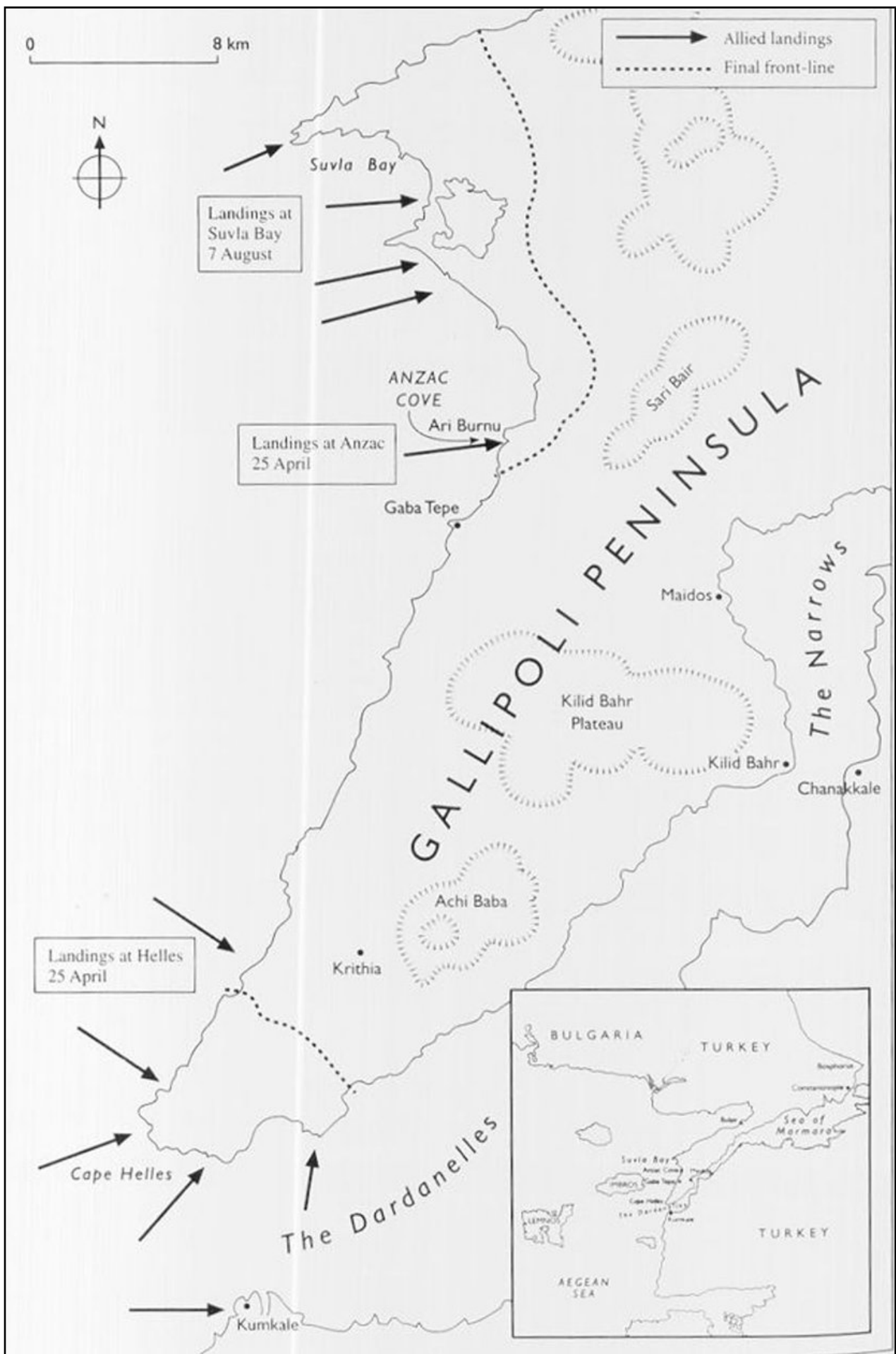

And in the morning.

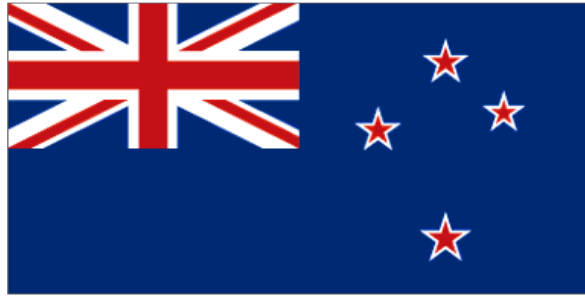
